### Online Resources

- **Bug Club** The link, username and passwords have been sent home. Books have been set.
- **My Maths** Links, usernames and passwords have also been sent home. We may set tasks from time to time but if no work is set, the children can access the tasks they wish to work on using the menu on the left (before they log in to My Portal) as well as playing the many games available.

### **Creative Curriculum**

- Choose from a list of projects.

### **Maths, SPAG and Reading**

- Complete the blank practice maths SATs tests. Even though SATs are cancelled, it'll be good practice and revision for them before Secondary School.
- Play the variety of maths games.
- 'Be the Teacher' on the filled-in SATs papers. Children can mark them in their choice of 'teacher pen', spotting the mistake and correcting them.
- Select spellings to learn from the Y3/4 and/or Y5/6 spelling lists and the list of homophones. Practice them using the spelling strategies and techniques given as well as playing the games with others wherever possible.
