Maths 1 (Recap)	100 square number recognition, one ten more and less, place value.	See parent information sheet at the beginning of task for alternative examples.	
Maths 2 (new learning)	Counting in 2's and 5's to 50 and 100.	Easier – keep very practical to support understanding of adding 2/5 every time. Harder – concentrate on becoming secure counting backwards from any number.	PDF document of the teaching slides attached to support teaching – go through this with the child as it is the teaching slides that we would use in class before children would complete the activity. Parent information sheet attached to activities to help parents in supporting the child's learning. I have attached 4 different activities, do not feel like you need to do each one it just gives you a choice of which activity best suits you. Continue on MyMaths
Reading	Become familiar with the story The Enormous Turnip. (provided as an e book) A reading	Easier – Listen to the story being read to you, then next time read the story with an adult by doing a shared read. Children to read the words they can.	Skills you could apply. Before you read take time to discuss the front cover. Who are the characters?

Phonics	<p>Recap all previously learned sounds daily. Repetition is key. Make a note of any unknown sounds and practise reading words including these sounds.</p> <p>Play Picnic on Pluto</p> <p>Phonics activity mat 1</p>	<p>Children see the grapheme (the sound written down) and say the phoneme (it's sound).</p> <p>Harder - Remove the picture clue to make it more challenging.</p> <p>Choose a level that suits your child.</p>	<p>Phase 2, 3, 4 and 5. Spelling, punctuation and grammar	<p>Practise reading and writing this week's superhero spellings. Can you spot them in your Bug Club books? Batman Words.</p>	<p>Easier - Have an adult read them out to you first.</p> <p>Harder - Can your child write them in a sentence?</p>	<p>See attached Batman words.</p>
Writing	<p>Introduction of the story The Enormous Turnip. Front cover,</p>	<p>Easier- Children to verbally construct a sentence and practise saying it before writing. To write sentences</p>	<p>Can be done alongside reading tasks.</p>

	blurb and book review activity.	using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Reminders to check the sentence make sense. Harder- Children may use the conjunctions 'and, but, because' to extend sentences. Children to add more than 1 adjective to character pictures and to attempt adjective/verb challenge on final page. Topic 1	Explore the signs of Spring- senses activity	Easier- children can draw pictures or talk about the signs of Spring. Harder- children can write about the signs of Spring or create a collage and explain why they have used certain materials.	See attached PDF teaching pages and activity sheet.
Topic 2	Explore the signs of Spring- craft activity	Easier- children can create a Spring flower following craft instructions. Harder- children can design their own Spring flower/ tree using different resources around the home eg. Lego, junk modelling.	See attached PDF teaching pages (last page) and instruction pages.
Extra	Sort the words on the eggs into the Easter baskets.	Easier – use the picture clues on the eggs to help. Harder - Can the children think of their own words including these sounds?	Children spot the previously learned grapheme in the words and match them to the correct basket.
