Maths 2	Practical use of volume Collect boxes in your house. Photograph them. Estimate the volume and then measure to check.	Make a poster to explain to a younger child how to calculate volume. Use pictures and measurements to help. You could make it 3D	
Writing SPAG	Write a set of instructions to make something in the kitchen. Include labelled diagrams. Remember recipes use imperative verbs. Make a list of all the imperative verbs you can think of/ find in recipes which could be used in a recipe.	Support Have a look at recipe books or recipes online for support. Extension Can you use parenthesis (brackets, dashes or commas to separate a relative clause from the main clause)?	Swap your recipe with a friend or give it to a relative to test out. Don't just copy a recipe.
Reading	Choose a character or setting from a book you are reading.	Draw a picture to either show the setting or the character. Use evidence, 'direct quotes', to support your interpretation.	The book could be one from Bug Club if you like.
Geography	Research food from around the world. Are there any dishes that originated in specific countries?	Using a map, locate where dishes are made. Can you find random ones? 'Scouse' is a dish which is made in Liverpool. Can you find any others for specific cities or counties? Make a list.
