Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Prehistoric	The period before written records.
Palaeolithic	2.5. million years ago to 10,000BCE when hunter-gatherers lived in caves.
Mesolithic	A middle period in Stone Age history.
Neolithic	Final period of Stone Age history from 10,000—4,500 BCE when farming was started in human settlements.
Timeline	A graphical representation of a period of time.
Settlements	A place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community.
Evidence	Facts or information indicating whether a belief or suggestion is true or valid .
Comparison	The quality of being similar or equivalent .
Woolly Mammoth	An animal with a long shaggy coat, small ears, and a thick layer of fat .
