9	King	The male ruler of an independent state, especially one who inherits the position by right of birth.
S	Heir	A person legally entitled to the property or rank of another on that person's death.
	Crown	A circular ornamental headdress worn by a monarch as a symbol of authority, usually made of or decorated with precious metals and jewels.
99	Throne	A ceremonial chair for a sovereign, bishop, or similar figure.
	Castle	a large building, typically of the medieval period, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers, and in many cases a moat.
	Coronation	The ceremony of crowning a sovereign or a sovereign's consort.
	Commonwealth	An independent country or community, especially a democratic republic.
	Landmark	An object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognized from a distance, especially one that enables someone to establish
