

### Prime Area: Communication & Language

- Understands and answers questions related to celebrations and people in our community.
- Builds up vocabulary related to celebrations and communities. Refer to Knowledge Organiser.
- Uses language to imagine and recreate roles in topic related role play and small world settings.
- Describe familiar events in some detail.

### Prime Area: Personal Social and Emotional Development

- To understand the importance of emotional and physical well-being and begin to know what to do if we are feeling 'in the blue'.
- Build constructive and respectful relationships.
- Begin to know what it means to be a good friend.
- Consider the feelings of others.
- Manage emotions and begin to know how to resolve conflicts.

### Prime Area: Physical Development:

- Talk about factors that support health and well-being.
- Follow instructions and move safely with co-ordination when moving in a large space.
- Develop fine motor skills in order to use a range of tools competently.

### Literacy: Reading

- Recognises Level 2 and some Level 3 phoneme/grapheme correspondence.

- Order objects according to size, length and weight.
- Add and subtract within 6.

### Expressive Arts and Design

- Learn how to make different colours by mixing paint.
- Celebration related artwork such as cards and decorations.

### Literacy: Writing

- Hear and write sounds in words.
- Begin to spell tricky words.
- Write about a celebration.
- Write about what they want to be when they grow up.
- Write a speech bubble for Santa
