You may remember that in the summer term we started to forge a link with a school in Kisumu, Kenya. This school is in a very deprived area and provides not only a great education, but also a meal each day, uniform and essential school items. They also provide family support for children, many of whom have lost both parents and are being cared for by wider family.



Pupil voice decided that they would like to help this small charity and make a difference. Our children and parents managed to raise an incredible £750 to send to Kenya.

We asked if the 'To Kenya With Love' charity could spend some of the money on something specific and tell us how it made a difference. The school choir had reached a national final; however this was 8 hours away and the school's funds could not cover the transport cost and overnight stay and it was far out of the reach of the families in Kisumu to pay for this. Luckily, our money arrived at the right time!

Many children had never left Kisumu before and they experienced many new things on their journey. They were able to stay in a school near to where the competition was taking place and were especially happy to try new foods.

They performed brilliantly on the day and came 6th out of the 21 finalist schools, which meant they were 6<sup>th</sup> in the whole country of Kenya!


