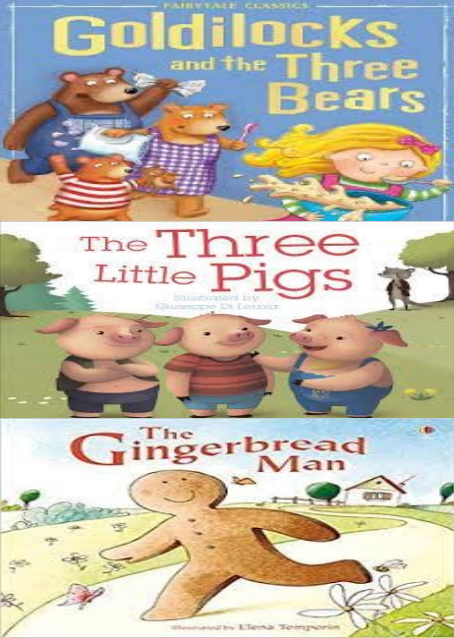


YR Once Upon a Time- Spring 1

Traditional Tale	A story that has been told for many years.
Past	The past is any time before now.
Character	A person, animal or figure in a story.
Author	The person who wrote the book.
Illustrator	The person who draws the pictures in a book.
Material	What something is made from.
Texture	A texture is how something feels when its touched.
Predict	To say what you think is going to happen.
Float	Something that sits on top of the water.
Sink	Something that drops to the bottom of the water.
Resilience	Keep going even if you find something difficult
