YHA York hostel offers an ideal base for school groups as it is just a mile away from the beautiful city centre along a traffic-free riverside walk.

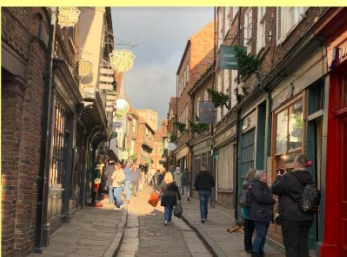

The children's safety and security is paramount.
As such, staff have visited and approved the hostel
and the venues for the off-site activities.

A comprehensive risk assessment will be completed
in advance of the trip to ensure all potential risks

What will I eat?



The hostel offers a dedicated groups dining area and a menu catering for all dietary requirements.



Children will pre-order meals to avoid any delay at mealtimes.

All children are asked to bring their own water bottles and can refill them at any time.

There are 2 classrooms equipped with whiteboards, projectors and AV equipment available for the on-site workshops and activities.

Where will I sleep?



Most bedrooms in the hostel are ensuite. Some have shared shower and toilet facilities located near to the room.

All rooms are in close proximity to one another in a designated wing of the hostel.



Where will I sleep?



Each occupant will have their own reading light.

The hostel is staffed 24 hours a day in case of emergency.



There will be separate dorm areas for boys and girls.
Great care will be taken to ensure that children are placed in rooms with at least one friend.

What activities will I do?

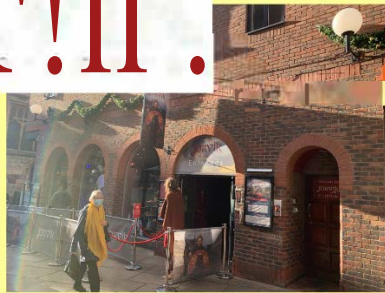
The YHA reps have an extensive knowledge of the city and will lead all aspects of the trip, including on and off-site activities.
