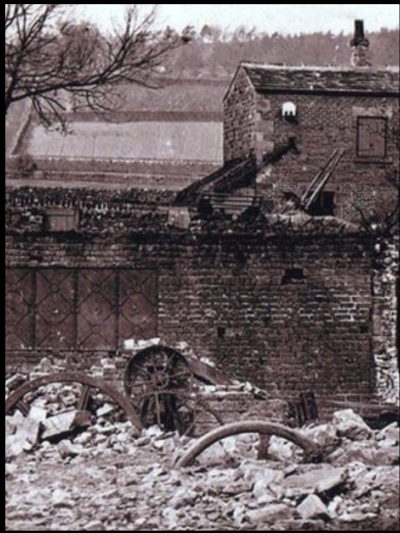


Sheffield Flood 1864 (History) ~ Y5



Sticky Knowledge:

- To understand the significance of the industrial revolution within this time period for Sheffield and the wider world.
- To understand why new dams needed to be built in Sheffield because of the migration of a workforce from the country to the towns and cities.
- To understand why the flood disproportionately affected the working class.
- To understand why a public enquiry was needed.
- To understand how the improvements in photography and the printing press made a local event a national story.
- To understand differing attitudes to family and how Victorian society **treated lives as commodities to be traded?**

- Go for a walk around Dale Dyke Dam, Bradfield/Abbeydale Industrial Hamlet.
- Talk to your child/children about what they have learnt at school.

In KS3 pupils will study - Britain as the first industrial nation and the impact on society.
