	Definition	
Rigid/stiff	Unable to bend or be forced out of shape; not flexible.	
Bendy	Capable of bending; soft and flexible.	
Flexible	Capable of bending easily without breaking.	
Transparent	Allowing light to pass through so that objects behind can be distinctly seen.	
Translucent	Allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through; semi-transparent.	
Opaque	Not able to be seen through; not transparent.	
Absorbent	Able to soak up liquid easily.	
Waterproof	Covered or treated with a material to prevent water coming	
Dull	Lacking brightness, vividness, or sheen.	
Shiny	Reflecting light, typically because very clean or polished.
