

Ecclesall Primary School Curriculum Overview Year: Three Term: Autumn 1

English:

- Using spelling strategies to practise new spellings for example: saying it silly or silly sentences to remember unusual spellings
- Revision of word classes when writing a description of our class animal
- Revision of sentence structure using word building strategies
- Descriptive writing based on animals
- Writing instructions linked to making a spooky sandwich

Maths:

- Place value with 2- and 3-digit numbers
- Count forwards and backwards in ones, twos, tens and hundreds
- Reading and writing large numbers and knowing the value of the digits
- Group and order numbers of varying sizes
- Mental arithmetic for addition and subtraction
- Addition using a written method

Science:

- Food and nutrition.
- Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition.
- Animals including humans cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.
- Exploring healthy food choices

Routine Homework:

- Read together 4 times a week discussing the characters and plot. Fill in reading records together.

Computing:

- Learning how to login to Google Classroom
- Programming – sequence in music

Music and MFL:

- Percussion lessons with Sheffield Music Hub.

- Numbers and plurals.
- Connectives and simple sentences.
