




What is on the papers?

Maria bakes cakes and sells them in bags.




She uses this formula to work out how much to charge for one bag of cakes.

Reporting of results

Scaled Scores

Tests will be graded numerically
The score of 100 will be the *Expected Standard*Range 80 - 120

Reading out of 50. 2025 a raw score of 28+ correct gave 100 score. (40+=GD) SPAG out of 70. 2025 a raw score of 35+ correct gave 100 score. (54+=GD) Maths out of 110. 2025 a raw score of 58+ correct gave 100 score. (95+=GD)

Normally receive results in the first week of July.


As you know, the children sat their End of Key Stage 2 SATS exams in the Summer Term 2022. We have now received results from external markers and these are reported for your child in the table above.

In order to achieve EXP the children needed to have a standardised score of 100+, GD required a standardised score of 110+. Raw scores required to achieve each descriptor are in the table below:

	Reading	Spelling & Grammar	Maths	- 30
EXP +	29/50	35/70	58/110	- 84
GD	41/50	55/70	96/110	

There are no "tests" for Writing or Science and these subjects are Teacher Assessed. There is no judgement of GD for Science.
