Who were the Ancient Maya and why were they successful?



End Points:

The Maya lived in present-day Mexico and Central America

The Mayans were a civilisation with a welldeveloped culture and way of life:

- They invented objects and systems which advanced their way of life.
- They invented farming techniques to make different regions fertile

We know about the Maya from their writings in glyphs, advanced number system and their buildings that are still there today.

	Word	Definition
l-	Architecture	The art of planning, designing and constructing buildings
h	Civilisation	A human society with a well-developed culture and way of life, living in a particular period of time
e	Glyphs	Mayan writing system which used over 1,000 different signs, each representing different words and sounds.
	Hierarchy	A system of organising people into different ranks or levels of importance, for example in society
١٠	Indigenous	People or things that belong to the country in which they are found
t	Mesoamerica	A historical region in southern North America. Derived from the Greek meaning 'middle America'
	Noble	Belonging to a higher rank in social society from birth
	Society	A large group of people that share the same laws, rights, and resources
	Trade	The activity of buying, selling, or exchanging goods or services
	Terrace farming	Walls are built to make small flat fields one on top of the other to increase farmland in mountain areas.
