Sticky Knowledge:

Prior Learning

Children have learnt about significant people in their families, school and local community. They have looked at how our grandparents had different childhoods to our own and grandparents had different toys then. We have looked at photographs from their own past and from the time of their grandparents' childhoods, asking and answering questions. They have sorted objects into 'past' and 'present' and introduced timelines to order objects within living memory.

Future Learning

Children will deepen their knowledge of life during the Victorian times. They will learn about other significant people from this time such as Queen Victoria, George Stephenson, Lord Shaftsbury and how Sheffield changed. They will learn about The Great Fire of London and how significant events affect the everyday lives of people.

How you can help at home:

Discuss the past and family from the past. Talk about changes between the past and present.
